

TITLE I DEFINED

- Title I is a federally funded program under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965(ESEA).
- Title I funds are targeted to schools with high numbers of children receiving free and reduced lunch
- Pioneer High School is eligible for school wide assistance

PURPOSE OF TITLE I

- Help students to achieve proficiency on state academic standards-primarily in Reading/Language Arts and Mathematics
- Build teacher capacity through quality professional development
- Enhance parents' abilities to help their children succeed through parental involvement activities.

USE OF TITLE I FUNDS

- Funds must Supplement not Supplant other state and federal funding sources. Funds may not be used to pay for services that should be provided under state and/or local funding.
- Implement school goals and objectives
- Support individual student achievement

HOW TITLE I IS USED AT PIONEER HIGH SCHOOL

- Supplemental personnel: Attendance & Online Staff
- Professional Development
- Intervention Classes
- 1:1 Technology
- Counselor, Tutor, TOSA
- Researched based instructional strategies
- Instruction delivered by highly qualified teachers and Paraprofessionals
- Targeted interventions for identified students
- Parent involvement activities, instruction, and guidance for becoming involved and active at school and at home with students

ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Every Title I school must have a written Parent Involvement and Parent Accord policy. They describe how the school and parents share responsibility for student achievement.
- Every school must report information about yearly progress
- Every school must report the highly qualified status of every teacher working at the school

HIGHLY QUALIFIED TEACHERS

- Competency in subjects taught

ASSESSMENTS

Title I requires that students are tested in reading and math every year in grades 3 through 8

Title I requires that students are tested in science at least once during grades 3-5.

Students who are limited English Learners (ELL) have to have tests of English proficiency to measure oral language, reading and writing skills in English.

WIDA Access, ACT, State Science, and End of Course exams are given in High School
